Greetings, fellow alumni members. This past year we've been involved in a number of major projects, which I'd like to share with you. Since I have space limitations with this column, I'll only describe the highlights of each project. More details can be found in articles within this newsletter

Schools Merge:

Last Summer, the much anticipated merger of Bok and Southern took place in a smooth transition. It included the movement of shop equipment, computers, graphic arts and photographic equipment, to name a few. This can only be attributed to the hard work of Principal Hackney, the administrative staffs and dedicated teachers of both schools. Southern now has a student population in excess of 1500.

Bill Gates Scholarships:

The infamous Bill Gates of Microsoft recently established the "Gates Millennium Scholarship Program". It provides funds for 1,000 students nationally, the scholarships of which pay for undergraduate and graduate studies. This past year a Southern student named Phat Nyugen was the proud recipient of this prestigious award. In addition, he was kind enough to draft an article for this newsletter. Congratulations to Phat and his supporters that include his family, administrators, teachers, and friends.

Roof Garden:

Several years ago the thought of having a roof garden on a school was nothing less than a dream. A proposal for Southern's roof soon emerged and plans began to take hold. The roof has an area of 5.5 acres, portions of which to be used for: growing vegetables, collecting rain water, and for solar panels. Fund raising last year has reached over \$25,000 that will be used for planning & architectural expenses. One of the major organizations providing logistical support for this effort has been LoMo (Lower Moyamensing Civic Association).

Chubby Checker (http://www.chubbychecker.com/) is still twisting after 50 years, with scheduled performances throughout the United States and Canada. After "The Twist," he continued to produce Top 40 hits, several of which were dance-themed titles. Some fans consider Chubby Checker "the undisputed 'Dance King' rock 'n' roll singer of all time."

Buddy Greco (http://www.buddygreco.co.uk/), an original member of Frank Sinatra's Rat Pack, has a new CD album entitled Buddy Greco and His Jazz Friends that was released in August 2013. Buddy is writing his autobiography, I Had a Ball - The Swinging Life of Buddy Greco.

Thank you, SPHS, for your education and great traditions

I entered the 10th grade at South Philadelphia High School for Boys in January 1955. Because many members of my family, and parent's families, had attended SPHS, I had heard stories over the years about my new high school—from its promoting academic excellence to fostering pride in the institution to preparing its students to face future worldly challenges.

My Immediate family members who were Southern High graduates included my parents, Jack Milner, Class of 1923; my Mom,

Jean Borowsky Milner, Class of 1924; and my sister, Renee, who graduated in 1952

As an incoming freshman I knew it would be a challenging three years, starting with trying to find my way around a huge, fort-

like building that was separated by a delineated border between the girl's and boy's schools.

The popular song, "Standing on the Corner Watching All the Girls Go By," might have been modeled after the boy-girl separation areas at SPHS. Having gone to co-educational elementary and junior high schools (Vare and Furness, respectively, it was a new experience to see lots of guys lining up to catch a glimpse of girls, while adding comments I'll omit here. (I didn't know what the girls were saying about the boys. And I recall some lucky boys and girls attended classes in the others' "territory.")

Mine was the last non-co-educational class to attend our school. The next class, which started in September 1955, joined us in the old building for a term in a co-ed setting.

Now on to the new school, with its squeaky-clean classrooms and hallways, and elevators that could swallow a large class. Compared to the old school, the new one was light years ahead in terms of its facilities, but still lacked the history and spirit that would evolve over coming years.

From our new school, we were watching, feeling and hearing wrecking balls attempting to tear down the old nearby school, brick by brick. But our old school seemed immune to the wrecking balls' assaults, as if it were telling us it wouldn't go quietly. And it didn't, because they really built those old schools solidly back in 1907.

It was difficult concentrating on our classroom lessons, while secretly cheering the old school's resilience during its inevitable destruction, which we sadly watched through our windows.

But eventually our old school gave way, and piles of rubble and a half-century of history were trucked away, signaling that our classes would now lead a new generation of SPHS students in a new location.

Our January 1958 class co-presidents, Madeline Mazzola and Joseph Cellini, assisted our popular principal, Joseph Rossi, in placing a time capsule in a cornerstone of the new building, which was dedicated on November 7, 1957.

Fortunately, historical and sports relics from our old school were relocated in the new one, reminding us not only where we came from—but the fantastic people who went before us.

South Philly High School—old or new—still lives on warmly in our hearts, wherever we are.

Now retired, Milner was the long-time Public Affairs Officer at the Norfolk Naval Shipyard in Portsmouth, VA, a sister facility of the Philly Navy Yard. He also spent about half of his more than 45-year career working in the chemicals and textile industries, as well as being a public affairs contractor for NASA at Cape Canaveral, from the mid-1960s to the mid-1970s.






SOUTHERN ARCHIVES

The Lanza brothers played their violins for almost 100 years combined with the Fabulous Philadelphians of the Philadelphia Orchestra that included 13 Southern graduates at the same time when Lou joined Joe in 1964. Lou recently retired from the ensemble after 47 years and still plays for the Philly Pops and at other venues. Joseph played for 48 years until his death in 2006. Lou and Joe inherited their talent from other entertainers in their family, and that talent, perfected by hard work and love and devotion to music, continues with the new generation of Lanzas, who perform throughout the United States and beyond.

A former colleague said of the Juilliard graduates and Jay Speck protégés:

"I never knew of two more amiable musicians than these brothers, whose love for music was so readily apparent."

Joseph also performed with Maestro Zubin Mehta in Florence, Italy with the Maggio Musicale Fiorentino and Joe and Lou performed with the Philadelphia Orchestra throughout the world. Lou has agreed to play briefly for us at our April 27th banquet; you don't want to miss that treat.



Joseph Daughen (Class of June 1952)

Joseph R. Daughen was for a half-century a prominent Philadelphia journalist (Evening Bulletin and Daily News) and author who traveled the country reporting on the civil rights movement, five Presidential campaigns, the Vietnam War, Watergate, the assassination of the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., and national, state and local affairs. During his career, Daughen (pronounced "Dawn") was twice a Pulitzer Prize finalist, won many reporting and writing awards, including the National Conference of Christians and Jews Brotherhood Award, two Philadelphia Press Association Gold Typewriters, and both the PPA Best Writing and Best Reporting Awards, the only journalist to win both. A Temple graduate, Daughen is a best-selling author ("The Wreck of the Penn Central") and was named one of the five Outstanding Young Men of the Year by the Junior Chamber of Commerce (1966). Daughen also is co-author of "The Cop Who Would be King," a biography of Frank L. Rizzo, and sole author of, "Fearless," a biography of Philadelphia lawyer Richard A. Sprague. He is married to the former Joan Purdy and they have one daughter, Joan, whose husband is the novelist Robb Cadigan ("Phoenxville Rising"), and two grandchildren, Ryan and Caroline.



Thomas Sebastian (Class of June 1963)

Currently serving as the Southeast Regional Mentor Coordinator for the Pennsylvania Institute for Instructional Coaching, and consultant for the Penn Literacy Network, Tom started his career in education in 1968 as a business education teacher at BOK AVTS. During his 29 years with the School District of Philadelphia, he served as a teacher, department head at Southern High, assistant principal at Pickett Middle School and West Philadelphia High School, administrative assistant to the District Four Superintendent, and principal of Northeast High School. For most of his career in Philadelphia, Mr. Sebastian also worked with the Standard Evening High School as a teacher and ultimately as an evening school principal. In 1997, Tom left the Philadelphia School District to accept the position of principal of Jenkintown Middle/High School and then served as the principal of Penncrest High School from 2000 to 2005. After retiring from the principalship, he accepted a position with Foundations Inc., as a Leadership Mentor and later as the Director of the Pennsylvania High School Coaching Initiative. Tom earned his Bachelor's degree from Temple University and his Master's degree from Villanova University.

Since exceeding our \$26,300 goal back in June, LoMo and SPHS have held a series of community design meetings for neighbors, teachers, students, and the greater South Philly community. 


"The Musicians of Southern High" Scheduled for Alumni Brunch
