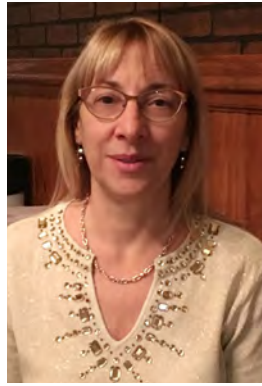

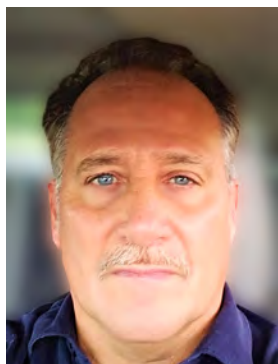

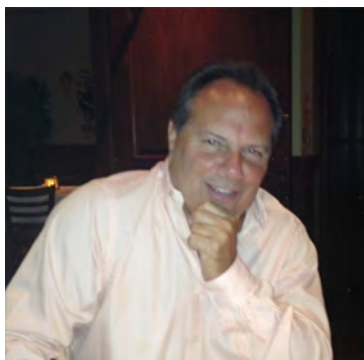
STEVEN DEPRINCE



Class of 1975

Steven was an outstanding athlete and student at SPHS. In his three years at Southern, he played football, basketball, baseball and was on the swimming team. On the Basketball Team in his junior year he was a starting guard and a backup guard in his senior year. On the Football Team he was a starting defensive back in his junior year and the starting quarterback, defensive back and punter on the football team. He was named to the All Public team as a defensive back and played in the first City All Star Game as a defensive back and punter. He was selected to the Eagles Roman Gabriel Football Camp at Ursinus College for quarterbacks in 1974. In baseball he was the varsity starting shortstop for 3 years, and a member of the 1974 and 1975 All City Baseball Championships teams. He was named as an All Public shortstop and selected as the Bulletin Scholar Athlete of the year in 1975. He placed 8th in the City Championships in 1974 in the 100 Backstroke and also swam in the 1975 City Championship in the 100 Freestyle, Backstroke, medley relay and anchor in the 4 x 100 Freestyle Relay event. Steven is married to Jayne for 15 years and resides in Vineland, NJ. He is the father of 2 children Steven and Eric, and 4 stepchildren, Rachel, Aaron, Brianne and Benjamin. He is a Christian and involved at his church the Pitman Road Church of Christ. Steven works as a Development Manager.

Class of 1972

In Ron's junior and senior years at Southern, he was the starting shortstop on the varsity Baseball Team. And in his senior year he was the starting halfback on the varsity Football Team. He was voted in as an All-Public shortstop in his junior year. In his senior year at Southern, Ron was honorable mention All-Public in football. Also, in his senior year he was an All-Public and All City shortstop in baseball. He also received the Bulletin Outstanding Scholar-Athlete Award, the Student Athlete of the year from the SPHS Alumni Association and the Celia Pincus Award from the Philadelphia Federation of Teachers. He was a 3-year member of the National Honor Society and ranked 15th in the 1972 graduating class. He attended Temple University and majored in Business. Ron has 2 children, Nicole and Ron Jr. He's the proud grandfather of Michael, his daughter's son and the expectant grandfather of a boy due in January 2018. For the past ten years he has been in a relationship with Gina Sansone. He worked 39 years for the City of Philadelphia. He was a volunteer coach with the Delaware Valley and Southeast Youth Associations. In his youth he worked at Columbus Sq. He is now happily retired! Ron enjoys summers at the Jersey shore and spending a lot of quality time with his children and grandchild. Ron states that he has never missed a summer at the Jersey shore in 63 years.

JOE MARGOLIS



Class of 1954

Joe was a back-up guard on the 1954 SPHS basketball team, one of the finest basketball teams in history and this can be attested to by the fact that 4 of the 5 starters are in the SPHS Athletic Hall of Fame. Joe's accomplishments started shortly after he was hired by Brooklyn College in 1963 as a lecturer in the Dept of Health and Phys Ed. In a letter of recommendation for Joe, an "Iconic" DIV.1 athletic coach, summarized Joe's resume to a condensed form. He stated, "I do not believe you may again come across a resume as diversified as Joe's". In 1964, he was appointed head coach of men's swimming—a team that had not had a winning season in 28 years. As head coach for 11 years, his teams won 10 championships. He excelled as an Athletic Dir. in charge of 20 teams for men and women. He is the author of numerous publications on sports, and several appeared in the New York Times." He has often been referred to as, "One of the most widely published athletic directors in the nation". He created an Athletic Hall of Fame in his first year as Athletic Director. Joe was invited by the Speaker of the House, of the New York State Senate to give a presentation to State Senators on Athletic Concerns. He started a movement for a major sports complex in Brooklyn. He was invited to appear on a popular late-night talk show, with the Pres. of a Private University to discuss legislation which would have greatly affected the "Final Four" March Madness. Hard work and determination led him to the top of the Athletic Dept. of Brooklyn City College. He retired as a full Prof Emeritus. He states "I really enjoyed my career-never dull"!!



FRANK LEONE

Class of 1957

began his studies in music with Philadelphia's celebrated composer and Southern graduate, Romeo Cascarino, at the age of 14. After playing at Southern, he received a scholarship at graduation to the Philadelphia Conservatory of Music, where he studied with Southern High Cultural Hall of Fame member Vincent Persichetti. Frank received his bachelor's and master's degrees from the Curtis Institute of Music. He was the pianist in the main showrooms for both The Las Vegas Hilton and Caesars Palace (1971-1975) and worked with some of the biggest names in show business. He has expertise as a musical director, conductor, pianist, and arranger. He was the musical director of The Minsky Follies at the Aladdin Hotel (1968-69). Frank accompanied a cadre of stars that include: Frank Sinatra, Andy Williams, Steve and Edie, Carol Channing, Anthony Newly, Roy Clark, Ben Vereen, Robert Goulet, Tom Jones, Sammy Davis Jr, Ike and Tina Turner, Gladys Knight and the Pips, B.B. King, Ann-Margaret, Tony Bennett, Goldie Hawn, Sergio Franchi (1969-1970), Paul Anka (1975-1982), Engelbert Humperdinck (1983-1984), Red Skelton (1985-1994), and Elvis Presley, with whom he also toured. He served as the musical director for Franchi, Anka, Humperdinck, and Skelton. Frank served as President of the Musicians' Union of Las Vegas for 14 years and is president emeritus of the union.



ROBERT K. MERTON

Class of 1928 (Deceased)

Sociologist Robert K. Merton, SPHS Class of 1928, is considered a founding father of modern sociology and is recognized for the work he contributed to criminology. He started his sociological career at Temple and Harvard, taught at Colombia, Harvard, and Tulane, and was one of the seminal authors in the sociology of science. He received a Guggenheim Fellowship and was the first sociologist to be named a MacArthur Fellow. He was awarded the US National Medal of Science, the first sociologist to receive the prize. Some of Merton's works deal with theories of the middle range, clarifying functional analysis, dysfunctions, and manifest and latent functions. His publications include "Science, Technology and Society in Seventeenth Century England," "Social Theory and Social Structure," "The Sociology of Science Sociological Ambivalence," "On the Shoulders of Giants: A Shandean Postscript," and "The Travels and Adventures of Serendipity: A Study in Sociological Semantics and the Sociology of Science." Some phrases that are attributed to him include the self-fulfilling prophecy, role model, dysfunctional, and conceptual analysis. His son, Robert C. Merton, is the winner of the 1997 Nobel Prize in economics and his daughter, Vanessa Merton, is a Professor of Law at Pace University School of Law.



JOHN NELSON SR.

Class of 1955

founded NELSON in 1977. During his years of leadership as President and Principal of Design, the firm grew into a top five commercial interior design firm with offices nationally. At the same time NELSON gained recognition through winning major projects as well as design awards and cover articles in industry publications featuring the work. Some of the more notable local projects; Cigna's World Headquarters, Liberty One Building, Sun Oil's 10 Penn Center Building, and the Fidelity Bank Building (now Wells Fargo) Renovation/Restoration. This project won the restoration of the year and was the film site for the movie "Trading Places" starring Eddie Murphy. Today as the firm's Founder and Principal of Design, his efforts are dedicated to building global recognition for creative solutions and mentoring young designers to promote design excellence. In addition, each year under the guidelines of the U.S. Green Building Council, he organizes employees from the various offices to volunteer their time to needy schools to build things ranging from an outdoor classroom for thirty to a library with new furniture and books. John continues to be active in seminar panels nationally and civic and community groups and is a guest lecturer & critic at the collegiate level.

DR. KENNETH STEIN

Class of 1961



Dr. Kenneth Stein attended Vare Elementary, Furness Junior High, Southern (Class of 1961), Temple University (BA in Biology-1964), and Temple School of Medicine (1968). He served a one-year medical internship at the Einstein Medical Center in Philadelphia and completed a 3-year

Residency in Dermatology at the Hospital of the University of Pennsylvania (1969-1972). He served in the U.S. Army (72-74) as Assistant Chief of Dermatology, Letterman Army Hospital, Presidio of San Francisco. Ken entered solo practice in June of 1974 as a board-certified dermatologist and dermatopathologist in Santa Rosa, Ca. After practicing for 42 years, he retired in 2015. Ken continues in his capacity as the Principal Investigator for Dermatologic Drug Research Studies at Radiant Research Company (Synexus Research). He has supervised over 50 clinical drug studies over the past 15 years. He was Assistant Professor of Dermatology, UCSF, and served as a Director in the 20-30 Club, and other community charitable organizations. Ken is married to his SPHS sweetheart, Sandy, for over 52 years. Sandy Austin Stein, a talented artist, was inducted into the SPHS Cultural Hall of Fame in 1997. Ken is so honored to return to his origins and cherished SPHS to receive this special award. His selection is especially enduring and timely as he celebrates his 75th birthday.

Benjamin Ferrara and John Ferrara, Class of 1986, are twin brothers who own Twins Auto Body and Twins at Fox Chase Auto Body. They were official members of the South Philadelphia Chapter of Unico with 17 years of service. Unico is an Italian-American service organization whose original purposes were to engage in charitable works to support higher education, and to perform patriotic deeds. They helped to raise awareness of the chapter by building its membership and introducing new programs and events that raised in excess of a 1/4 million dollars for Unico recipients, which included Children's Hospital of Philadelphia, Sisters of the Poor, Gift of Life, and St. Christopher's Hospital. John and Benny founded their own organization, Founding Hearts Foundation of Philadelphia. Their Other Volunteer Work Includes Huddle Up for Autism, Speak and Learn, Toys for Tots, and Clothes for the Needy. They marshaled the Columbus Day Parade for 5 years. They were named two of the "Top 20 People Making a Difference in South Philly." John and Ben said, "We always feel as though all the money we raise, we want to give it back for research and different treatments that we can for the kids, because they deserve a fair chance at life. No matter what happens, they deserve a fair chance at life."

Elizabeth "Liz" Juliano-Olivieri (Class of 1975), has served on the Executive Board of the Alumni Assoc for 32 years. Graduating from La Salle College, she embarked on a career in education. She took a detour from this career to become a commercial underwriter as an Account Executive Officer for The Travelers Ins Company for the past 35 years. She earned her professional "Chartered Property Casualty" designation which is a hallmark in the insurance industry.

Being the youngest of 5, she grew up with a desire to help others. Her loyalty spurred her to support her alma mater, volunteering her time to the Alumni Assoc in various ways. She obtained grants and a sponsorship for a past teacher to travel cross country in support of education.

Liz's sense of service extended to helping establish a charitable organization, 'Scouting For A Cure Foundation, Inc' with her brother in law in memory of her sister-in-law. Florinda Olivieri-George passed away at 44 years old after battling breast cancer. This inspired her husband, to establish this Org where Liz serves as secretary-treasury.

Herb Jung was the first Asian-American principal of Southern High when he served from 1989 till 1993. After graduating from Roman Catholic High School, he received his BA from LaSalle College and his MEd in school administration from Temple University. He was also the first Asian-American to be appointed as a vice principal in Philadelphia at a junior high school (Stetson). To assist Asian Americans in having better representation in the School District of Philadelphia, Herb founded the Asian American Educators Association, which still flourishes today. At Southern, one of Herb's goals was to revitalize the Language Magnet Program, which included increasing the study of the Italian language and culture. He worked enthusiastically on school security and the improvement of the music program. He coordinated with his department heads, including Tina Petrone (science) and Gene Alessandrini (mathematics) to improve the curriculum. The science department made great strides in teaching about environmental technology, and the mathematics department excelled in providing advanced courses in mathematics. A Drexel University- Southern High agreement allowed Southern juniors and seniors to take college calculus courses for credit if they later matriculated at Drexel. Under Mr. Jung, advanced placement testing in mathematics was greatly enhanced with many students earning college credit when they achieved high test results.

Joann Custodio, (nee Abate), Class of 1971, called South Philadelphia H.S. her second home for over 60% of her life. After graduating in 1971, she went on to attend Temple University where she earned her B.S. and M.Ed. degrees in Mathematics Education. She returned to student teach at Southern in early 1975, and then permanently joined the staff that September. Joann enjoyed a fulfilling career teaching mathematics and computer programming at SPHS until her retirement in 2009.

Joann met her soul mate Joe at Temple. They married forty years ago. Watching their children Jillian and Joseph become successful adults along with their loving mates Tom and Maggie, respectively, has been a source of unparalleled pride. Lucille - age 5, Elena - age 2¾, and baby Custodio - due March 2018, fill Grandmom's heart with tremendous joy!

Joann is honored and grateful to receive the SPHS Alumni Award of Excellence, and will always hold her alma mater in great esteem.
